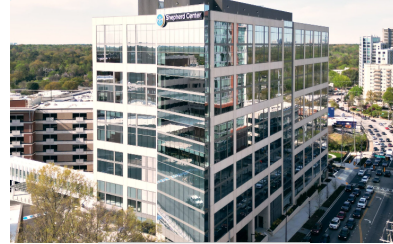
Location and Parking: MCAR, Marcus Center for Advanced Rehabilitation, Floor 10
