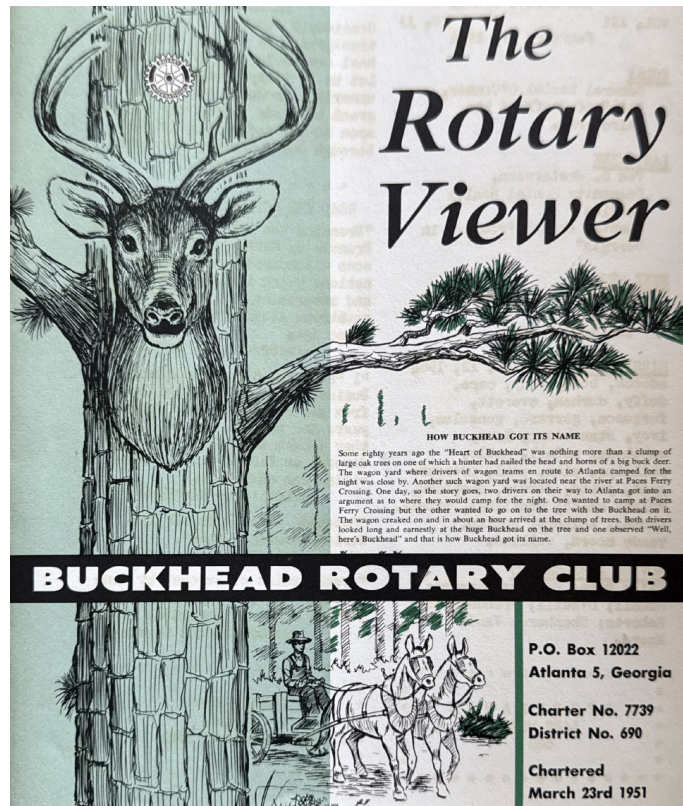

Gentlemen:

At a meeting of the Schools and Scholarship Committee held on
October 30, 1963, the following resolutions were passed:

1. Beginning with the 1964-65 academic year, three equal scholarships of \$500 each will be offered to deserving students in the high schools of the Buckhead Rotary Club area.
2. These scholarships will be granted for the first year at any four-year college or university in the State of Georgia.
3. Each high school in the Buckhead Rotary Club area will be requested to nominate two candidates (one boy and one girl) on the basis of prescribed qualifications of academic standing, personal character, demonstrated need, and acceptance by the college or university chosen.
4. Final selection of the three recipients of the scholarships will be made by the Schools and Scholarship Committee of the Rotary Club of Buckhead.
